

# Colorado Child Passenger Safety Law Update

*If a child can be placed in more than one category, then the child should be placed in the more protective category.*



REAR-FACING  
CAR SEAT

A child under 2 years old (as long as they are less than 40 lbs.) must be secured in a rear-facing convertible or infant seat in the back seat.



FORWARD-FACING  
CAR SEAT

A child at least 2 years old and has outgrown the manufacturer's height or weight limits for a rear facing car seat must be secured in a forward facing harnessed car seat.



BOOSTER SEAT

Children at least 4 years old and 40 lbs who have outgrown their forward facing car seat with internal harness must be secured by a belt-positioning booster seat using the lap and shoulder belt.



SEAT BELT

Children who are at least 9 years old, has outgrown their booster seat, and can pass the **"5 Step Test"** may be restrained by lap and shoulder belt.

***A child under 13 years old should sit in a back seat of a motor vehicle, if a rear seat is available.***

***Children under 18 must be properly restrained.***
